Top Funding Priorities and Recommended Initiatives:

1. Youth Services & Activities

Initiatives including after-school clubs, mentorships, sports, skill-building workshops, neuroinclusive projects, support for Young Carers, projects to promote responsibility, equitable opportunities for young people experiencing poverty.

2. Transport

Community-driven transport schemes, shuttle services, infrastructure enhancements, and initiatives that improve safety and reliability of local transport links.

3. Antisocial Behaviour

Suitable initiatives include community patrols, enhanced CCTV, youth diversion activities, and neighbourhood watch schemes.

4. Health & Wellbeing

Projects including mental health support groups, community fitness sessions, nutrition and healthy eating education, and accessible wellness services for all age groups.




5. Environment & Place (Maintainance)

Projects to promote care and pride in the oca environment, including parks and public spaces, improving pathways, lighting enhancements, and promoting community gardening initiatives and preserving nature.

6. Heritage & Tourism

Initiatives preserving local history, promoting tourism, or offering visitor engagement through guided experiences and activities.

Top Funding Priorities and Recommended Initiatives:

1. Health & Wellbeing

Initiatives supporting mental health, community fitness, nutrition education, gardening and food projects, and wellness activities accessible to all.

2. Youth Services & Activities

After-school clubs, Youth mentoring schemes, Youth Clubs offering later-evening spaces and support, Sports and events, Projects offering meaningful experiences or skill-building, neuroinclusive initiatives and projects to support Young Carers and those experiencing poverty.

3. Environmental Sustainability

Community-led initiatives promoting environmental responsibility, sustainability practices, gardening projects, recycling, and local conservation efforts.



4. Building Stronger Communities

Activities and events that foster community cohesion, such as festivals, local clubs, intergenerational projects, and initiatives encouraging pride and connectivity among residents.

5. Antisocial Behaviour

Initiatives addressing antisocial behaviour through community education, outreach programmes, conflict resolution support, youth engagement in sports, creative workshops, and skills-building activities promoting safer, harmonious neighbourhoods.

6. Education & Skills

Lifelong learning opportunities including digital literacy workshops, adult education tailored to local needs, employability training, entrepreneurship support, mentorship schemes, and initiatives preparing residents for evolving career opportunities.





Trevethin, Penygarn & St. Cadocs

Top Funding Priorities and Recommended Initiatives:

1. Environment & Place (Maintenance)

Projects focused on community clean-ups, maintaining parks and public spaces, improving pathways, lighting enhancements, and community gardening initiatives.

2. Youth Services & Activities

After-school clubs, youth mentorship, sporting activities, skills training, neuroinclusive projects, educational trips, and events specifically supporting young people and young carers.

3. Health & Wellbeing

Mental health interventions including qualified therapy sessions, targeted support for vulnerable groups, therapeutic animal initiatives, nutritional education, and wellness services accessible to all community members.

4. Older People's Activities

Activities designed to reduce isolation among older residents, including social clubs, befriending services, mobility support, and affordable social outings.




5. Crime & Community Safety

Community patrols, CCTV enhancements, neighbourhood watch schemes, and youth activities designed to divert individuals from antisocial behaviours, ensuring safer community environments.

6. Education & Skills Development

Projects promoting lifelong learning and skill-sharing, including community-based classes on digital skills, cooking, gardening, practical repairs, creative workshops, employability training, skill-swap initiatives, and environmental education workshops addressing local concerns like littering and fly-tipping.


