


Jason Harrold

Arts. Culture & Heritage



Bois Y Bryn are a volunteer shanty singing group formed in 2021, now with 17 singers and 4 musicians of all ages, who give their time freely to bring communities together across Torfaen and beyond. They perform weekly in care homes, community venues and festivals, raising thousands for charities such as Cancer Charities, SARA, RNLI and Wales Air Ambulance. While keeping all their concerts free and accessible. Entirely self-funded, they combine music, history and community spirit, making them a recognised and much-loved group that unites people from all walks of life

Evan Smith runs the junior band with warmth and encouragement, always bringing a smile to his role. He teaches brass to children with no prior musical background, giving them opportunities they wouldn't otherwise have. Through his dedication, he helps keep the brass band tradition alive, investing great skill, time, and commitment into the next generation.





The Blaenavon Heritage Museum volunteers dedicate over 4,000 hours annually to preserving the town's industrial and social history, offering guided tours, research projects, and family ancestry sessions. They support schools with WW2 reenactments under the Welsh curriculum and run dementia-friendly outreach in care homes with memory boxes. Their work ensures locals and visitors alike can learn, connect, and take pride in Blaenavon's vital role in the Industrial Revolution.





Pontypool Community Council has 21 elected members representing local wards and working with Torfaen County Borough Council on issues affecting Pontypool and the wider district. A dedicated staff team, led by the Clerk, manages administration and finances to ensure efficient operations. Together, they engage with residents to identify priorities and make a positive impact in the community.

Age Connects Torfaen -The Sports Connect Programme offers weekly, dementia-friendly physical activity sessions that combine gentle sports with cognitive stimulation, social connection, and emotional wellbeing for people living with dementia and their carers. Facilitated by trained staff and supported by community partners, the programme promotes inclusion, confidence, and joy while educing isolation and improving both physical and emotional health. Beyond exercise, it fosters community, dignity, and a sense of belonging, demonstrating how sport can have a powerful social impact





Croesyceiliog Rugby Club is a community hub offering inclusive sporting opportunities from toddlers to seniors, alongside a wide range of classes and activities such as choir, dance, yoga, and fitness. The club fosters connection and wellbeing by providing a welcoming space for socialising, events, and community groups, often free of charge. Tori & New Inn Juniors AFC is a long-standing volunteer-run football club supporting over 150 local children in a safe, inclusive environment.
